Fabio Ciciliano Biography

Fabio Ciciliano, born in Naples in 1972, graduated in Medicine and Surgery from the University of Naples Federico II and specialized in General Surgery. He further enhanced his education by earning a master's degree in Public Administration Sciences and another master's degree in Economic Sciences. Additionally, he completed several advanced university courses focusing on emergency management, CBRN weapons defense, and international coordination of civil protection activities.

Initially serving as a Volunteer Doctor and later as the Medical Director of the Italian State Police, he has been involved in multiple rescue missions in Italy and abroad, gaining extensive expertise in managing health emergencies and providing aid to populations affected by earthquakes, floods, epidemics, and other natural or human-made disasters. As an expert in nuclear and radiological risk, he also participated in humanitarian assistance missions in Japan following the tsunami that affected the Fukushima nuclear power plant.

In his previous roles, he held significant positions at the Central Directorate of Health - Department of Public Security of the Ministry of the Interior and at the Italian Civil Protection Department. His contributions included developing directives and best practices for disaster and emergency assistance, coordinating technical panels, and supervising projects in the healthcare and logistics sectors, particularly for events with notable local impact. During the SARS-CoV-2 pandemic, he served as a member of the Technical-Scientific Committee (CTS) established by the Italian government in 2020.

In September 2023, he was appointed Extraordinary Commissioner to address social decay and youth distress in the municipality of Caivano.

Since July 2024, he has been Head of the Italian Civil Protection Department.
